This event aimed to promote a transdisciplinary discussion on gender equality problems and the vulnerability of specific social subjects, given the changes currently taking place in the family as a constitutive element of society and the corresponding projections in national and international Family Law. Gender equality was addressed in marital relations, de facto unions, parental responsibilities, medically assisted procreation, and the multiplication and informality of family relationships - to propose ways and mechanisms to resolve specific issues. In addition to the guest speakers, this event included presentations resulting from a call for papers.

### **Mission Out**

Our researcher Natália Moreno attended the kick-off meeting of the PERSIST project on 1 March in Lucerne. The PERSIST - Positive EneRgy diStrIctS driven by ciTizens project was approved in the DUT (Driving Urban Transitions) Call for Proposals 2022, as part of the "Positive Energy Districts Transition Pathway", and is coordinated by the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts. At UCILeR, the team led by researcher Fernanda Paula Oliveira includes Fernando Borges and Natália Moreno. PERSIST aims to gain a better understanding of how socio-economic, socio-cultural, and socio-political factors shape Positive Energy Districts (PED) and their interrelationships with technological, regulatory, and investment aspects in different geographical, cultural, and economic contexts.

From April 23 to 25, Fernando Borges took part in the annual conference of EARMA (European Association of Research Managers and Administrators), which was held in Odense. The UCILeR researcher gave two presentations: 'Supporting The Development Of Young Researchers' using the example of UCILeR's work in the Researchers' Camp and in supporting applications and 'Project Submission Is A Losing Game?' on the evaluation metrics of projects that were not funded. The last paper was presented in collaboration with researcher Rita Farinha from UC's CEMMPRE.



### Collaboration protocol signed with the Pollux Association

The University of Coimbra, through the UCILeR, signed a collaboration protocol with the Pollux Association - Space Technologies, on 4 April 2024.

The aim of this protocol is for the two organisations to work together with common objectives relating to the promotion of research, educational development and the promotion of research projects in the field of geo-law/Space Law. This protocol formalises the informal collaboration that already exists between Pollux and two UCILeR researchers who are members of Pollux's Advisory Board.

Pollux, founded in 2021, is the only Portuguese junior initiative in the space sector, formed by a group of students from the University of Coimbra, which aims to simplify and support the relationship between the space industry and students. ### UCILeR researcher publishes book on responsible legal research

Responsible Legal Research and Innovation is the title of the book edited by our researcher Alexandra Aragão, in collaboration with Émilie Gaillard, and published by Mare & Martin.

The main aim of this book is to develop the field of legal meta-research by providing guidelines for future legal research and innovation that correspond to the European vision of ethics, social involvement, gender equality, open access and scientific education.

This activity, which lasted around two hours, was aimed at master's, doctoral, and post-doctoral students and young researchers from the Faculty of Law of the University of Coimbra. This information session aimed to raise awareness of the importance of conveying the topics researched at the UCILeR to society, providing tips on planning and evaluating communication activities aimed at non-specialist audiences.





### Commemorating the 50th anniversary of 25 April: the words the revolution conquered and the words it overthrew

On 23 April, undergraduate Design and Multimedia students from FCTUC, under the guidance of Catarina Parente, participated in creating a mural to commemorate the 50th anniversary of 25 April. The mural is available to visit in the Cloister of the Colégio da Trindade until 25 May.

This mural includes 7 words overthrown and 7 conquered by the revolution, which resulted from a challenge to law students to nominate words that reflect change in different areas of law. The public is also invited to contribute words and post them on a panel.

At the end of this initiative, the students shared their opinions on 25 April in an informal conversation with our researcher Maria João Antunes, and other lecturers and students from the Faculty of Law of the University of Coimbra.



### **Project applications**

March and April were very busy and diverse months in terms of submitting projects for funding. Internationally, the UCILeR coordinated the PhD SKILLS application under the Erasmus+ programme, in partnership with the Universities of Iasi (Romania) and Jagiellonian (Poland), aiming to promote transversal skills among PhD students. Nationally, within the scope of the FCT's call for projects in all scientific domains, UCILeR coordinated three applications: coordinated by the researcher Maria João Antunes, a team presented the proposal FIT for Democracy - Footprints for Integrity, Transparency and Democracy; researcher Carolina Cunha proposed the application SOWing - Steward Ownership - Implementation at National Level and researcher Fernando Borges submitted the proposal KnowLAWdge - Knowledge brokerege in Law, the last two within the framework of exploratory projects. Internally, two teams led by UCILeR researchers are competing in the 4th edition of the Initiative for the Promotion of Scientific Culture, organised by iiiUC. Researcher Marta Graça is taking part in the Plan D - Dialogues with the Law initiative and a group of PhD students are presenting the Student's Net proposal. Finally, as part of the FCT's call for PhD scholarships, the UCILeR supported more than 10 applications as a host institution.





I – NEXUS: Innovation Agenda for Digital and Green Transition

Researchers at the UCILeR/FDUC: Carla Barbosa, Stéfani Reimann Patz and Fernando Borges

Purpose: Promotion of an Agenda around logistics and transport networks, focused on innovating, developing, demonstrating and initiating the valorisation and exploitation of products and services with strong export potential that address the main challenges and gaps identified in logistics in Portugal. The NEXUS Agenda will create an ecosystem of 28 products and services for the Green and Digital Transition in the transport and multimodal sectors. At the centre of this ecosystem, the core product, is the Nexus Open Data Collaboration Platform, comprising a set of applications and services (Nexus Federated Applications and Services). Finally, the Nexus Harware Assets component, of innovative hardware products that exploit IoT principles and promote important synergies between the open data collaboration platform and the other applications and services. Each of these will have its own digital representation (digital twin), aimed at sharing and receiving data to improve the performance of operations.



### **II - EU-CIEMBLY**

Purpose: EU-CIEMBLY aims to design a new tool for participation in the EU, not only from a theoretical point of view but also by setting up pilot assemblies that will make it possible to formulate relevant legal and political recommendations in the field of citizen participation.
