### International Workshop on Corporate Governance Discoveries and Innovations

On 8 July, Coimbra hosted the International Workshop on Corporate Governance Discoveries and Innovations. This event brought together experts from different continents to discuss the latest research and innovations in corporate governance.

The Workshop addressed corporate issues such as the governance of public pension funds, fiduciary principles, and the primacy of beneficiaries. The extraterritorial implications of the new European Sustainability Directive, the regulation of ESG information, and its implications for insider trading in the United States were also discussed.

This event emphasised the importance of a dynamic and innovative approach to corporate governance, highlighting the interactions between regulation, market practices, and emerging technologies.



### Mission out: Researchers participate in international criminal law meeting in France

Researchers Anabela Miranda Rodrigues and Susana Aires de Sousa participated in the 21st International Meeting of the International Association of Criminal Law (AIDP), which focussed on the subject Artificial Intelligence and Criminal Law, from 25 to 28 June 2024 in Paris.

Researcher Lucía Muñoz Benito participated in the event "Just transition and Participatory Democracy. EuComMeet Conference at the European Committee of the Regions", held in Brussels on 26 June.

This event presented the results of the H2020 EuComMeet project, shared lessons learnt and illustrated the main features of the Platform for Deliberative Spaces.



Mission out: Researchers attend event in Denmark

Researchers Carolina Cunha and Inês Martins participated in the Workshop on Comparative Enterprise Foundation Law (ELI project on enterprise foundations) at Copenhagen Business School on 20 and 21 June 2024.

The researchers presented a paper on the Portuguese legal framework for enterprise foundations and participated in debates on the experience with enterprise foundations in various jurisdictions. They also took part in working groups dedicated to the construction of model rules on this subject.

This mission is part of the POWer Project, underway at the UCILeR, which is analysing ways of organising companies that prevent or discourage short-term profit motives, in line with sustainability objectives.





Mission out: UCILeR researcher participates in panel at science 2024 meeting

Researcher Carla Barbosa participated in the "Engineering and Health: Revolutions in Care and Quality of Life" panel at the Science 2024 Meeting in Porto between 3 and 5 July.

The panel, led by the ARISE Associated Laboratory with the participation of the Pedro Nunes Institute, discussed how the continuous advancement of technology has transformed how we look after our health and improve our quality of life. Carla Barbosa presented the CHANGER project, of which she is a researcher at the UCILeR, focusing on the ethical, social, and regulatory aspects associated with the continuous advancement of technologies and their relationship with healthcare and improvements in quality of life.







Mission out: Researchers take part in Training School on Human Rights and Artificial Intelligence in Athens

Researchers Alexandre Dias Pereira and Louise Amorim Beja took part in the 'Athens Training School on Human Rights and Artificial Intelligence', promoted by the Global Digital Human Rights Network and the National & Kapodistrian University of Athens, which took place between 3 and 5 July 2024 in Athens.

On 4 July, Alexandre Dias Pereira presented the topic 'EU Regulation of Digital Services and Global Digital Human Rights'. The training provided enriching debates on the challenges of and advances in artificial intelligence from a human rights perspective.



Mission out: Researchers take part in seminar on evacuation planning and management in rural fires

Researchers Fernanda Paula Oliveira and Beatriz de Mello participated in the seminar "Evacuation Planning and Management in Rural Fires", held on 6 July at the Sala da Nau of the Valenças Palace in Sintra, as part of the project Evacuar Floresta - Evacuation Decisions and Plans in Forest Fire Scenarios. At the seminar, the researchers took part in a panel on the legal aspects of evacuation planning in forest fire contexts, discussing the legal framework for evacuation plans in Portugal, the limits of private individuals being bound by evacuation orders and international best practices.

The event also featured panels on rural fire risk analysis, the importance of cartography in evacuation planning, modelling the evolution and evacuation of fires and the Portuguese experience in the Chilean fires. It was open to firefighters, civil protection agents and the general public.



### Mission out: Researchers participate in an international conference in Madrid





**Purpose:** Improve the availability and accessibility of training and education in research ethics and provide tools for ethical analysis at European level, including the unique challenges of AI research.

**Purpose:** The preparation of a research project on the impact of migration in different contexts of citizenship in today's complex and heterogeneous societies, thus presenting itself as one of the possible measures to be implemented in pursuit of the millennium Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) proposed by the UN. This objective is pursued here through critical reflection and consequent proposals for the implementation and enforcement of legal systems and social policies for the sustainable development of societies.
